Bentleigh Cricket Club was established in August 1909 and in season 2018/2019, we celebrated our 110th season.

Our aim is to foster an active participation in sport (cricket) for junior and senior players of all ages and gender, while providing a responsible and enjoyable social environment for members, families, and supporters.

We currently have four senior teams, eight junior teams and run the successful Woolworths Blasters Cricket program (one of the largest in the region).

Our Men's and Women's seniors are affiliated with Cricket Southern Bayside (CSB) with our top two Men's Senior teams playing in a two-day competition on Saturdays our thirds playing in a Saturday one-day competition, and the fourths, or Junior Development Team, playing a one-day competition on Sundays. All senior teams play on turf. The Women's team played in the 2nd Division of the Women's competition on Sunday's.

Our juniors are affiliated with SECA and are comprised of U16's, U14's, U12's and Rookies.

Our main ground is Bentleigh Recreation Reserve located at Arthur St Bentleigh (behind the Bentleigh RSL), with our second ground at Centenary Park Oval 2, located at Bignell Rd, East Bentleigh. Our juniors play at Duncan Mackinnon Reserve and Victory Park, while our Woolworths Blasters run on a Friday night at our main ground in Bentleigh.

We welcome players of all ages, gender and skill, and encourage anyone to come down and be a part of what has been an amazing Club for more than 100 years.

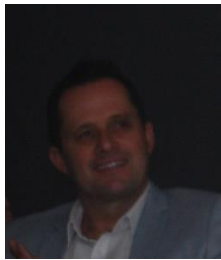

We had 18 players representing BCC Women's Team this season. 8 returning players and 10 new players. This is a massive achievement for a team that didn't exist 2 years ago. It's a validation of the culture that everyone involved in the team has been working to build.

On-field Improvement

2018/19 saw us win our first game and the first stirring rendition of the Red and the Blue was sung. In fact we won four games in total including being the only team in our division to beat the premiers East Malvern. While we were not in contention for the final, improvement in our on-field performance was easily visible in the stats. Last year our opponents were making ten times as many runs/wicket as us, this year we managed to pull that back to 1.2 times. Last year our performance saw us losing games by an average by 93 runs. This year it was only 17.

We are part of the club now

Our first year was one of quiet nurturing as we introduced many women to a completely new sport and built the team and the competition as we went. This year however we were intent on becoming integrated into the club. In addition to having a voice on committee, our players provided regular assistance at Blasters and we were strongly represented at social functions. The ladies' day event was a great success with women from across the club (players and non-players alike) building great connections. Barefoot bowls, the Christmas function, the RGL and the Presentation night saw the women's team warmly welcomed into the fold and we saw connections and friendships built across all corners of the club.

- Vastly improved bowling and fielding – last year 100 runs per wicket, this year 18
- Top score for the season was Diana Prider's 24 not out against Cluden in round 4
- Best bowling for the season was Marina Jansz's 3/12 against Cluden in round 2
- Women's team award recipients: Caitlin Sexton (Bowling) & Trish Jeffery (Batting & Club Champion)

needed to fill gaps (even when they had to resort to playing in just socks). Thanks to Dave McN, Steve Mcg, Paul C, Jason A, Jarrad D and Mick F for their support of the women's team and the management of the club overall and to the wider Bentleigh club and community for welcoming us. Thanks to the coach James Robinson who puts in countless hours making sure we can not only play, but enjoy the experience (even training). Thank you to the families and friends (particularly the kids) whose encouragement and practical support help make it possible. And finally, thanks to the team, it's you that make your team-mates come back week after week.

Next season & call to action:

Our goals for 2019/20 will see us aim to field two women's sides in CSBW and support the formation of girl's teams to play in the All Girls Cricket Competition in the 13 and Under and 16 and Under divisions. We are always interested in warmly welcoming new players, even mid-season. All abilities, level of experience and age are welcome. Encourage your girlfriends, partners, wives, sisters, mothers, daughters, cousins, aunties, nieces, friends to come along and give it a go. Don't assume they are not interested!
