I know that whoever takes up the role and becomes the 29th President of our great club will have the same support that I have received.

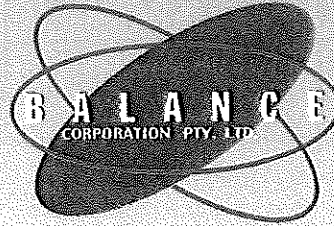

## Audit Report to the members of Bentleigh Cricket Club Inc

### Scope

I have audited the financial report of the Bentleigh Cricket Club for the year ended 30<sup>th</sup> June 2013. I have conducted an independent audit of the financial report in order to express an opinion to the members of the Club on its preparation and presentation. No opinion is expressed as to whether the basis of accounting used is appropriate to the needs of the members.

My audit has been conducted in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards. My procedures included examination, on a test basis, of evidence supporting the amounts and other disclosures in the financial report. These procedures have been undertaken to form an opinion as to whether, in all material respects, the financial report is presented fairly in accordance with the cash basis of accounting whereby revenue is recorded when it is received, expenses are recorded when they are paid, and no assets or liabilities, other than cash and bank balances, are recorded.

Statements of Accounting Concepts and Accounting Standards are not applicable to the cash basis of accounting adopted by Bentleigh Cricket Club Inc.

The audit opinion expressed in this report has been formed on the above basis.

### Qualification

As is common for organisations of this type, it is not practical for the club to maintain an effective systems of internal control over donations, subscriptions and other fund raising activities until their initial entry in the accounting records. Accordingly, our audit in relation to donations, subscriptions and fund-raising were limited to amounts recorded.

### Qualified Audit Opinion

In my opinion, subject to the effects of such adjustments, if any, that might have been determined to be necessary had the limitation referred to in the qualification paragraph not existed, the financial report presents fairly the payments and receipts of the Club for the year ended 30 June 2013 and its cash and bank balances as at that date in accordance with the cash basis of accounting as described above.

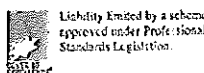

## Director of Cricket's Report – Russell Keyt

One often struggles to find a starting point when writing a report in reflection on the past months and the performance of the club. As most focus on the 1<sup>st</sup> eleven as a bench mark, one tends to reflect with disappointment, regret, what may have been and lost opportunities. The way forward is to acknowledge and accept what went wrong, what we can do better, how we can, and what worked.

We can look back at match results and find reasons why we were unlucky not to win some games. We can argue that no-balls cost us wins, field placement, the toss of the coin, poor decisions and on it can go. However the bottom line is we were the problem. We focused at times on areas that really we shouldn't have, the focus should have been on improving ourselves as cricketers and playing cricket. There simply are too many people outside the framework and structures of the club, getting involved in matters they should express through that structure and not through "Bar room talk". As an Executive, Committee and Match Committee we need to deal with these and other matters, which are detrimental to the smooth operation of the club, in a more expedient manner. In other words, follow the process. Adam Ryan was a mere teenager not long out of short pants when he played his first game for the 1<sup>st</sup> eleven at Bentleigh. He went on to have a very successful career at St.Kilda before returning to Bentleigh to put something back. We didn't have the success that many of us hoped for, but I believe there are players who developed their own games under his tutelage. Thank you for your efforts and we expect to see you and enjoy your company as a supporter of Bentleigh during the seasons ahead, in the future. A great job was done on Friday nights with the Milo kids.

There was a lot to be pleased with from the season just gone. It is true with a greater focus and concentration we could easily have finished higher up the ladder, and even playing finals. Going into next season we can expect and demand greater return from the likes of Jeff Keyt. He has grown over the last couple of seasons and now has to step up and be one of the premier batsmen in Senior Division. Rob Ciccarella improved his wicket-keeping from the start of the season to finish the season as an accomplished gloveman. He also is growing into the role of batting more responsibly at 7 or 8. His best knocks weren't big scores, but he spent time at the crease and saw the team succeed. Chris Street has been somewhat of a lone hand as someone we have looked to win games with bat or ball. Thankfully Streety should get valuable support from new players committed to the club, Greg Todd and Chris Williams, throw in Tom Sephton and maybe Streety can become more of an impact player, than workhorse. Adrian McInnes is player who can expect to be more of an impact bowler as well; his role may well be very different from years gone by. We have the basic framework of a very good team and with the possible inclusion of a couple of other recruits and the youngsters coming through, should prove to be very competitive.

The 2<sup>nd</sup> eleven has once again made finals and unfortunately lost in the semi-finals. They have had a great run over the last few years, in fact thinking back, they seem to always be playing in finals. However the time has come now to push up a lot of the youngsters at the club. Unfortunately this may well be at the expense of older players who are still very good 2<sup>nd</sup> eleven players but not at the level to play regular 1<sup>st</sup> eleven. However, this is a challenge that all players need to take on.

However, I digress. This year's Captain's report is not going to focus on the 1<sup>st</sup> XI performance. The stats and records are there on My Cricket for everyone to see. In summary, 2012-2103 was an interesting year.

The challenge from a playing point of view in 2012-2103 was;

1. For players that had been given opportunities in the previous year to build and become more consistent;
2. Whether established players could get more out of themselves.

Despite a few glimpses, the opportunities were squandered and senior players could have done more. All of us!

This year saw another influx of English players, which was and still is critical to Bentleigh over the next few years, as the bridge between the players in their late twenties and thirties and the kids coming through was and is too great. The demographic of our club, the gap that it has and the need to remain competitive whilst we bring in both a new crop of senior players and bring through the junior players that are maturing all the time. Without these players Bentleigh would most probably not have remained in Senior Division.

The exciting thing for me this year was Bentleigh's first academy player to play first eleven. Michael Keyt's training, ability to listen and commitment to better himself as a player certainly was a highlight for me. Check out his stats in both first and second eleven and he sits comfortable along his peers. Given the way his brother trains and the way his uncle and father approached their cricket, it is no surprise.

Moving forward, the club needs to make a clear statement as to what it stands for and support those in roles that are trying to establish an environment and culture that will extend well beyond the people. We cannot compete with clubs that have large playing budgets. Our competitive advantage is our facilities, our history and if we get it right, our junior program.

For every junior cricketer that becomes a ten year senior player they are worth \$5,000 in income at least to the Bentleigh cricket club. To me this is a simple maths equation and is so obvious that any argument that places restrictions on attracting junior players to our club either financially or from a resource perspective hurt the club's future.

From a cultural perspective, it needs to be said that players need to focus on playing cricket, their own game and supporting their teammates. Players have the right to seek clarification in regard to their

selection, however, any clarification or comment should be made through the proper channels. That being the Chairman of Selectors or your respective team selector (captains of each eleven). The strongest comment by players about selection should be to perform, which is the biggest statement that can be made. Chatting to other players and supporters about selection, should not be supported or encouraged. By following the process, whether it be; a committee members, players or supporters, we can address matters in a consistent or orderly manner. There are people appointed to resolve these issues and it is actually counter productive for the club to waste of allot of time and energy if this is not followed. It needs to stop.

By playing the young kids even if their roles are limited will always have benefits. These benefits range from individual to the broader group. Individual benefits such as gaining an understanding of the pace of the game, relationships and access to senior players whilst from a broader group perspective it demonstrates to others coming through that they too can compete at higher levels.

Players not completing training, turning up to training intoxicated and not informing the match committee of availability or when doing so not providing honest reasons is simply not acceptable. This is disrespectful to the match committee and captains, not to mention the Bentleigh badge that we hold in high esteem. This type of behaviour that obviously has been par for the course for some time is not one that will provide success. Not in the short term and not in the long term. The reason for these behaviours are not acceptable is that once you define what you stand for then those principles cannot be compromised.

I would like to thank Russell Keyt for his enormous support, insights and energy. Without Russell my role would have virtually impossible. To the committee I would like to thank them for the opportunity I am sure that the club will look back and say that the last two years has provided a platform that the club can build sustained success.

I would also like to thank the 'Great Man' Roger Kellar. Rog' I made a promise to come back and you are truly one of the great people that I have had the pleasure of being involved with.

To all the senior and junior coaches that give of their time great effort and again I am sure that the foundations that have been laid and the expectations of standards that have been set I am sure will be benefited in the longer term. To all the players that gave of themselves and worked hard adapting their games to be better. You guys will never know how much satisfaction and enjoyment I received by seeing guys implementing our discussions and ideas into a game and it paying off. Keep it going you will continue to get more out of the game.

I would also like to congratulate the committee on making a wonderful appointment of Greg Todd as Captain Coach for the 2013/2014 year.
